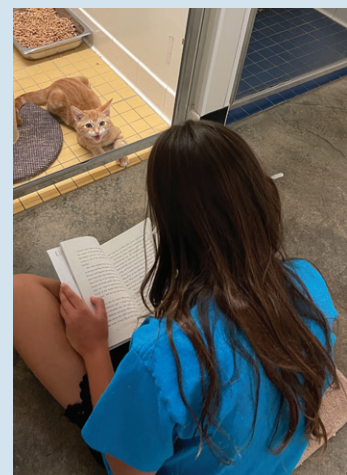


Pawty with Us

It should not be a surprise that “getting a puppy” is high on the wish list for most children during the holidays.

For one very special teen this past winter, receiving his wish for a new puppy was extra special.

Meet 13-year-old Paul, a gaming- and sports-loving kiddo. In July of 2017, at just 8 years old, Paul and his family entered an unforeseen journey when he was diagnosed with Juvenile Pilocytic Astrocytoma (JPA), a rare childhood brain tumor.

After completing treatment in 2017, Paul was in remission for three years. Then, in October of 2020, the cancer returned and Paul’s family prepared for another fight against the disease, this time with support from Keaton’s Cancer Center, an organization that provides families with information, resources, and education necessary to navigate the complexities of their child’s cancer.

“A child’s cancer diagnosis has the ability to change so many aspects of a family’s day-to-day life”, said Jasmine Fraijo, Programs Coordinator for Keaton’s. “Treatment for Juvenile Pilocytic Astrocytoma, as well as treatments for other diagnoses, can be extremely demanding of time, energy, and support.”



A PUPPY FOR PAUL

How Granting a Special Wish Brought This 13-Year-Old’s Smile Back

For Paul’s mother, Jonisha, finding a balance between traveling two hours round trip to Paul’s treatments each week and providing for her four young children has been difficult. To relieve some stress, Keaton’s

provided the family with a financial grant, as well as gas and food cards to aid with the cost of travel and other needs.

Paul and his family also participated in Keaton’s 2021 Holiday Adopt-A-Family Program, an annual initiative that pairs a sponsor with families to help make their holiday wishes come true.

Among Paul’s wishes were books, a bike, and the unique wish for a puppy!

A team of sponsors were quickly identified as a perfect match for Paul’s family. Irene Delgadillo, Transaction Manager at Belwood Investments, had a personal connection to Keaton’s and childhood cancer. Her brother, Juan, was diagnosed in 2013 with a brain tumor and during his battle, the family built a special relationship with Keaton’s. When Juan passed away in 2015 at the age of 11, Irene never forgot how

precious those moments were for her family.

Six years later, now a young adult, Irene wanted to give back to other children and families who were going through similar circumstances. “I chose to give back because of how much those opportunities meant to me and how much I know they meant to my brother,” said Irene.

Belwood Investments purchased gifts for Paul’s family and began looking for a special puppy. They had two months to prepare for the surprise and they hoped to adopt from a shelter.

Coincidentally, Belwood had recently developed a relationship with the Sacramento SPCA, so Irene reached out to the adoption center for help to fulfill Paul’s wish.

Nicole Sullivan, Adoption Manager for the Sacramento SPCA, began working with Irene and the Keaton's team to coordinate the potential adoption.

With the reveal date about two months away, and puppies finding homes within hours of becoming available, Nicole couldn't guarantee that a puppy would be available during the requested time frame. "We really wanted to help make Paul's wish come true", said Nicole. "So, we agreed to stay in contact and I would reach out if a puppy came in closer to their date."

As the end of November approached, the prospects of a puppy for Paul were looking bleak. Then, just days before Thanksgiving, a Good Samaritan found two Miniature Pinscher puppies and brought them to the Sacramento SPCA.

The puppies were two months old, and while one required a lengthy stay in foster care due to a broken leg, the other - named Tread - would be ready for adoption following his neuter surgery.

Could Tread be the right puppy for Paul?

About a week later and after a significant amount of collaboration between the shelter and Keaton's, a time was coordinated for Paul and his family to meet their soon-to-be companion. Coincidentally, it was just five days before Paul's 13th birthday!

The special gift would be a surprise for Paul and his siblings. Jonisha led them to believe they were going to the shelter after Paul's clinic appointment to support a friend and her dog. They were guided to a room where the puppy and the Belwood Investments team were waiting patiently with excitement.

After having a blast playing with the energetic puppy, the team shared the exciting news that the puppy was the family's to keep. The kids' faces lit up with smiles and they immediately started brainstorming names for him, ultimately deciding on Roscoe.

Roscoe had found his new forever family and was sent home with a

bed, toys, food, and lots of love, thanks to Belwood Investments.

After the new year, we followed up with Paul's family while Roscoe visited the shelter for his remaining vaccinations. Jonisha shared that Roscoe's spunky personality has been a wonderful addition to their family. She added that treatments have been difficult for Paul, with so much to process emotionally and physically. "I am forever grateful for the day that Paul met Roscoe at the animal shelter", said Jonisha. "That is one of the few times that I saw my son smile."

Now Paul is finding joy in playing with Roscoe and teaching him a lot of new tricks!

With Paul's special wish fulfilled with the help of three organizations working together, it reflects the tremendous impact of community partnerships to strengthen, support, and transform lives.

The Sacramento SPCA would like to thank Irene, Keaton's Cancer Center, and Belwood Investments for making this special wish come true for Paul and his family.

Honoring Nancy King

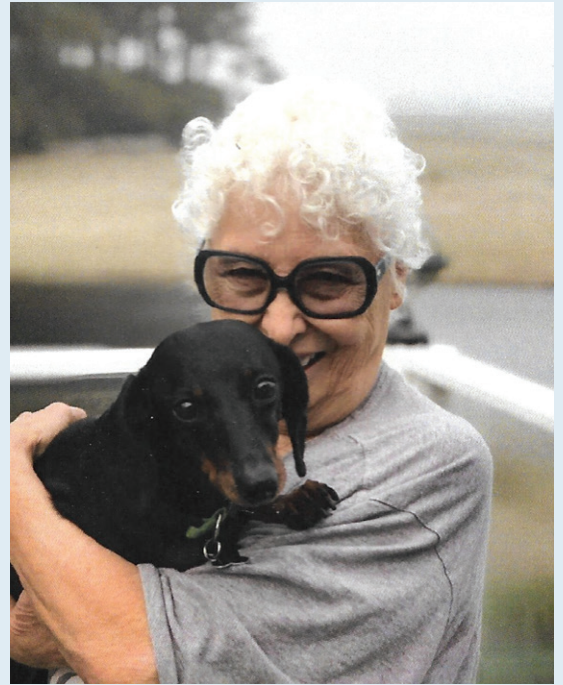
